He has proven tax appeal results with significant reductions realized for most properties contested, including several high-profile cases. The favourable decision associated with one such assessment appeal is recognized nationally as a precedent setting case vis-a-vis 'highest and best use'.

Mr. Power has extensive income and expense modeling experience, including in depth knowledge of Argus financial software, business modeling, and feasibility analysis associated with the hotel sector as well as the senior's care sector. He is an industry leader in industry related information technology, having led a large corporate team in development of an internal SharePoint portal, and having participated in development of a commercial software valuation database project.
